Indigenous Peoples to Canada

Indigenous Peoples to Canada is an umbrella term that the CMF uses to address and acknowledge the First Nations, Inuit and Métis Peoples who live in the territory that is today known as Canada and are descendants of the original inhabitants of this territory prior to colonization. Indigenous persons are encouraged to communicate their affiliation to one or more specific nations, communities, settlements, reserves or families to ensure the representation of their People's narrative sovereignty in a responsible way.

Racial and Ethnocultural Identity

Even for individuals who share a similar identity, there are a variety of ways for people to self-identify by racial, ethnic, or cultural backgrounds. In this section you will find different options to identify yourself knowing that preferences may vary significantly within groups that share a common background.

NOTE: The standardized identity categories below marked with a star () are considered "Black and Racialized Communities" by the CMF. The CMF recognizes that being Black and/or racialized is a social construct that cannot solely be determined by a DNA test or ancestry, but rather by the collective acknowledgement that individuals from these communities are seen as non-white and currently experience specific barriers, prejudice and discrimination in Canadian society. Indigenous Peoples to Canada are excluded from this definition.*

- Middle Eastern, West Asian or North African*: People originally or direct descendants from communities in the Middle East or West Asia and North Africa, including countries from the Arab world, Iran, Turkey, Israel, etc.
- South Asian*: People originally or direct descendants from communities in Afghanistan, Pakistan, India, Nepal, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Bhutan, Maldives, etc.
- Southeast Asian*: People originally or direct descendants from communities in Brunei, Cambodia, East Timor, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam, Palau, Micronesia, etc.
- East Asian*: People originally or direct descendants from communities in China, South and North Korea, Japan, Mongolia, etc.
- Central Asian*: Individuals who are originally or direct descendants from Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, etc.
- Indigenous Peoples from outside Canada*: Indigenous peoples from other regions not mentioned above such as Oceania, Pacific Islands, United States, or Northern Asia and Northern Europe.
